The results of the thesis offer interesting indications for the development of further research and interventions aimed at promoting the well-being of individuals and the community.

This project is proposed as an action-research intervention to promote wellbeing during the pre-degree course of university and AFAM students within the consortium (unifg, unimol, univr, unibz, uniroma europea, Foggia Conservatory and Verona Conservatory) in the domains identified by the I COPPE model (grouped into 4 domains: interpersonal-psychological, physical, economic-occupational, community), also through the prevention and combating of behavioral and pathological addictions. The partnership will propose (a) common actions - interventions, impact assessment and replicability and sustainability of the same - and (b) local actions aimed at students in their territory, in order to respect the peculiarities and needs of the same.

Scientific manager of the project "COS(GENDER)PLAY: Fighting gender stereotypes through play".

The aim of the project is to promote the psychological well-being of young women through the use of a digital tool that can educate men on gender differences, increasing their awareness of stereotypes and sexist attitudes and behaviors. The project includes four phases: the first phase will aim to deepen the state of the art regarding the use of digital tools for the prevention and promotion of the psychological well-being of young women; the second phase will outline the "typical situations" of everyday life, in which a young woman can be a victim of gender stereotypes and sexist attitudes or behaviors in adolescence; the third phase aims at identifying and applying a serious game that can develop awareness of gender issues in male adolescents; the fourth phase will finally aim at providing an evaluation of the project's impact.

The main hypothesis is that experiences of sexism, sexist attitudes, perceived sexism in the field of study and gender typicality have significant effects on self-efficacy in choosing an academic career and on well-being. It is also hypothesized that these effects are mediated by two variables: parental congruence and mattering. The hypotheses will be tested: in male-dominated areas (STEM), to examine the effect of discrimination against female students; and in female-dominated areas, to detect the phenomenon of the glass escalator.
