She is a member of EASA (European Association of Social Anthropologists), ABA (Associação Brasileira de Antropologia), BRASA (Brazilian Studies Association) and IUAES (International Union of Anthropological and Ethnological Sciences) and is a member of the Commission of Anthropology of Religion of the IUAES. She is a lecturer in the course of studies of the Master's Degree in 'Anthropological and Geographical Sciences for Cultural Heritage and the Enhancement of Territories (SAGE)', DICEM administrative seat - University of Basilicata, University of Foggia and University of Salento and the University 'Federico II' of Naples. She is the Scientific Director of the Ethnographic Laboratory of the University of Foggia, into which the 'Ester Loiodice' Centre for Visual Documentation of Celebrations in Capitanata and the Laboratory of the Anthropology of Intangible Cultural Heritage are located. RESEARCH INTERESTS

Her research interests focus on the following topics: ritual, symbolic systems, native ontologies, Afro-Brazilian religions, therapeutic practices, popular culture, transmission of memory, festive events, ethnic identity, processes of patrimonialisation and protection of heritage systems in local territories, cultural rights of traditional communities, identity politics and cultural diversity. For several years she has been conducting field research in Bahia (Brazil) in Afro-Brazilian religious communities (Candomblé) and rural communities (Quilombos), focusing on ritual practices and festive manifestations, intangible heritage, religious intolerance and racism, and ethnic-racial dynamics. Other research activities have concerned environmental vulnerability in the fishing communities of the Baía de Todos os Santos (Brazil) and the land rights of rural communities (Quilombos). Recently, she has focused on unofficial heritage, the presence of Afro-Brazilian cults in Europe and Italy, and the relationship between immigration, racism, religiosity and environmental vulnerability.

It was seen that they imply not only overtly prescriptive behaviour (do not do, do not eat) but also exploratory, in fact, part of these prohibitions s is initially unknown to the adept; the quizilas are recognised through sensitivity and allergy problems. Bodily sensitivity therefore plays an important role in Candomblé ritual practice.

FIELD RESEARCH

She has been conducting field research in Bahia, Brazil, in Candomblé (Afro-Brazilian religion) houses of worship since 1997, taking an interest in ritual behavior, religious symbolism and the relationships between initiation and bodily sensitivity. Between 2010 and 2014 she carried out field research in the Island of Itaparica (Bahia, Brazil), taking an interest in local therapeutic practices, Afro-Brazilian and syncretic cults (Afro-Catholic devotions in Candomblé and Umbanda religion)

and the cult of ancestors of African origin (Baba Egun). In 2013 - 2014, she participated in ethnographic research in several fishing communities in All Saints Bay to assess socio-environmental impacts due to the re-gasification terminal (TRBA). Since 2015, she has also been involved in rural Afro-descendant communities (Quilombos) in the Municipality of Cachoeira (Bahia) by participating in the drafting of anthropological documents in support of quilombo land claims and mapping of phytotherapy practices and traditional cures. Since 2016, she has been conducting, on a regular basis, research in the Recôncavo region of Bahia (an area historically linked to sugarcane production and slaverỳ), whose Afro-descendant population is characterized by a relevant artistic and festive expressiveness ((regional samba, called samba chula, capoeira, folkloric dances, street theater, festivities of the carnival cycle). In 2018, she collaborated in the process of heralding the 'Bembé del Mercato,' an important festival that brings together various of the aforementioned cultural and artistic expressions of the Recôncavo of Bahia. She has recently conducted field research in Candomblé and Umbanda houses in Italy and has been interested in the relationship between immigration, religiosity and environmental vulnerability.
