Prof. Dr. Riccardo DI CESARE

Riccardo Di Cesare, after graduating in Classics at the University of L'Aquila, was Research Fellow of the Italian Archaeological School at Athens (IASA), where he specialised in Archaeology and History of Greek and Roman Art, and earned his Ph.D. in Historical Sciences at the Advanced Institute for Historical Studies (Repubblica di San Marino). He is Full Professor of Classical Archaeology at the University of Foggia (Unifg). His research interests concern the archaeology, history and visual cultures of the ancient Greek and Roman Mediterranean. His works include the publication of the Roman sculptures of *Interamna Praetuttianorum. Sculture romane e contesto urbano* (2010), a book on early Classical Athens (*La città di Cecrope. Ricerche sulla politica edilizia cimoniana ad Atene*, 2015), and, as co-author, a monograph on the *Riace Bronzes* (also published in Italian and French, 2022) and on the *Stele of Kaminia, the Etruscans, and the island of Lemnos Stele of Kaminia* (also published in Italian and Greek, 2023-2024). He is currently directing archaeological excavations of Unifg at Alba Fucens (Italy), and the Archaeological Mission of Unifg and of the IASA at Hephaistia on the island of Lemnos (Greece). He is Research Delegate of the Department of Classics, Unifg, co-editor of the “Annuario della Scuola Archeologica di Atene e delle Missioni Italiane in Oriente”, Assistant Director for scientific activities at the IASA, and Director of the Inter-university School of Specialization in Archaeological Heritage, University of Bari “Aldo Moro” and Unifg.
